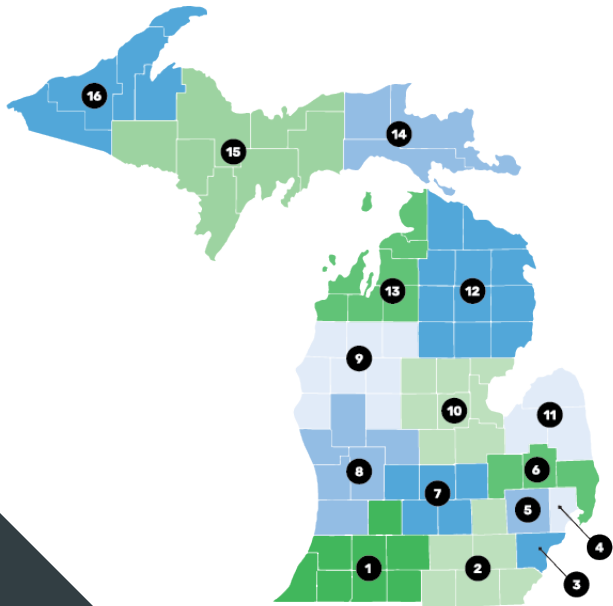

Did You Know?

- ' Demand for workers in STEM is expected to grow at nearly twice the rate of all other jobs
- ' Long-term employment projections show that Michigan will see over 16,000 job openings in STEM each year
- ' 76% of adults agree that STEM education is the best pathway to high-paying jobs for young Michiganders* but,
- ' 36% report that their children do not participate in any STEM learning*
